PRESENTATION BY HISTORIAN ROGER BARETTE

Roger Barrette, a senior civil servant and historian, is unfortunately unknown to the general public.



However, he was an administrative judge. He has taught history at the Université du Québec à Trois-Rivières (UOTR) and management at the Université Laval and the École nationale d'administration publique (ÉNAP). He is the author of several books and articles that have been published in Quebec and France. In 2019, he published with Septentrion, De Gaulle, Les 75 déclarations qui ont marqué le Québec (1940-1970). He was Secretary General of the Commission franco-québécoise sur les lieux de mémoire communs (CFOLMC). Previously, he was National President of the Association Québec-France and President of the Société historique de Québec¹. On August 24, at the annual meeting of the Association of Frigon Families, he described the journey of a remarkable figure of the 17th century, Louis Jolliet.

Mr. Barette has highlighted this aspect of this explorer. Joliette studied with the Jesuits. He became a skilled organist. He received the tonsure and minor orders from Bishop Laval. He left the orders at the age of 19. Hen studied cartography, hydrography and navigation (pilot).

At the annual meeting on August 24, 2024, only 4 members agreed to serve on the Board of Directors. Moreover, no member agreed to take over the editing and publishing of the bulletin. We therefore have no choice but to stop publishing our

With revenues from the fur trade, he financed the expeditions entrusted to him by Talon and Frontenac.

One of the mandates was "to discover the South Sea, through the country of the Madkouteins [or Fire Nation] and the great river they call Michisipi, which is believed to discharge into the Sea of California." Mr. Barette described in detail the **stages** of this memorable trip.

A few hundred kilometres from the mouth of the Mississippi, the crew had to turn back in the face of

Sioux hostility and the fear of being captured by the Spanish (Florida). On this expedition he was accompanied by Father Marquette, François Chavigny, Sieur de la Chevrotière, Zacharie Jolliet, Jean Plantier, Pierre Moreau, Jacques Largilier, a servant of the Jesuits, and Jean Thiberge.

This expedition proved that the Mississippi River flows into the Atlantic Ocean and not the Pacific.

This succinctly sums up this remarkable conference.

We have published a brief article on Gérard Frigon 9^{th} child of Ludger Frigon and Adiana Marchand jn the Spring-Summer 2024 issue of the Newsletter of the Association of Frigon Families ¹.

Donat Leduc was born on October 2d, 1892 in Saint-Prosper-de Champlain and died on November 7, 1959. Léontine Ébacher was born on le 2 September 2d, 1894 in Saint -Prosper-de-Champlain and died on September 9,1945.

They were married on June 19, 1917 in Saint-Prosper-de-Champlain, région Mauricie.



Gérard was born on November 19, 1906 in Sainte-Geneviève-de-Batiscan. His father Ludger Frigon and his mother Adiana Marchand were both born in Sainte-Geneviève². Hélène was born in Saint-Prosper-de-Champlain. Her father is Donat Leduc and Léontine Ébacher, She married Gérard on April 21, 1937. They lived on the farm from 1937 until their death.

Lucette was born on March 30, 1924, and married Roland Tessier in Saint-Prosper-de-Champlain.

She had 5 children (3 boys and 2 girls). Gérard, a man with a big generous heart, gave food and surely a bit of money to help Lucette meet the needs of her family.



YEAR 1953

In the January 10, 1954 issue of the Sunday newspaper³ « LA PATRIE », an article on the drama experienced by the family of Gérard and Hélène with the following headline: « CETTE STATUETTE DE LA VIERGE A EMPÊCHÉ NOTRE MAISON D'ÊTRE ENGLOUTIE DANS UNE AVALANCHE (*This statuette of the Virgin prevented our house from being swallowed up in an avalanche*) »

A STATUETTE OF THE VIRGIN, nestled in a maple tree, just above the ravine, protected the Frigon family from being swallowed up. On the right, Lise and Joan of Arc pray to the Holy Virgin to protect their home and family.



TWO CONSECUTIVE LANDSLIDES seriously threatened a family of seven children and three adults in the rural road Village Jacob. The Frigon family, who lived in a century-old house located just above the slide, almost got swallowed up in the Rivière à Veillette ravine.

ALL THAT REMAINS IS A GAP-ING HOLE AND AN ABAN-DONED SHED³

The house was moved on December 26, 1953 on a new foundation some three hundred feet from the hole.

In the newsletter « THE FRIGONS », there is a picture of the farm before the house was moved. You can compare before and after the move (see note 4).

The following note appears on January 27, 1937 in the registry of buildings in the parish of Sainte-Geneviève de Batiscan:

- No. 110 this lot belonging to Arthur and Léopold Marchand will be sold on March 3, 1937
- No. 111 this lot belonging to Arthur and Léopold Marchand was not sold (March 11, 1937)

We assume that Gérard and/or Ludger paid the taxes. Subsequently, on December 11, 1941, under number 112690, there is the note « Donation⁵ » from Arthur Marchand to Gérard Frigon.

Extract from Arthur Marchand's donation contract

to the recipient Gérard Frigon:

« ... at the charge also by the said donee to keep with him ... , the said donor, and Miss Antoinette Marchand, sister of the donor, to heat, sleep, light, feed, clothe and maintain suitable clothing and linen, shoes and ..., to provide them with the doctor in case of illness, a seat in the parish church ..., to provide them with all the needs, necessary help and sweetness, both in health and in sickness, and both spiritual and material needs according to the requirements of the case, until the death of each of them ... »

A confirmation by a judgment⁶ on December 19, 1942 under no. 114602 that Gérard Frigon, petitioner for the regularization of the title deed and to be declared the absolute owner of the following asset:

This model (Sedan) sold at the time for \$655.00 (USD). It was equipped with a 193.0 cubic inch inline 6 cylinder engine that developed 50 hp. The wheelbase was 107 inches. The bumper and spare tire were extras.

In an article on Gérard, 9th child of Ludger and Adiana published in the Spring-Summer 2024 Newsletter, we mentioned that Gérard went to the market in Shawinigan. Here is an excerpt of an article entitled William Frigon and his times II published in the Summer 2004 Quarterly Newsletter, volume 11, number 3:

« Prior to the construction of the « Maison neuve » (new house), the shed and the henhouse were demolished and the chickens were kept in the stable that continued for a long time to house visitors' horses, mainly horses belonging to Joseph, Benoit and Gérard Frigon, sons of Ludger Frigon, our grandfather's brother, who travelled some 35 miles by carriage or sleigh to bring merchandise from their farm to sell at the market. These trips from Sainte-Geneviève were very long and arduous especially in bad weather during the winter. On these occasions, they were often housed in our grandfathear's house or in our home.

Benoit, Gérard and Joseph were perhaps accommodated in this house during their trip to the market in Shawinigan.

Before Gérard could butcher in the fall, there was a long process. To raise the chickens he would later sell at the market, Gérard had built a cabin similar to a "fishing hut". At the beginning of spring, he bought chicks and every day we went to feed them and make sure there was plenty of water. He had a red lamp so that the heat was high enough so that the little chicks would not be too cold. I remember one day where I played a trick on my younger sister Monique; I locked her in the cabin with the chicks. As I was passing between the shed and the chicken coop, she caught me as I tried to escape. I got a good slap on the butt. After that, I never played a trick on Monique again.

Let's get back to raising the chicks. Gérard had built an enclosure to allow the chickens to get some fresh air and eat grass every day. We had the task every evening to make sure that the chickens were all in the shed and that the hens were in the henhouse. We had to make sure that the doors were closed properly so that the foxes wouldn't eat them.



For pig breeding, he had built a pigpen with 3 sections and steps. The first section was for the sow with her little pigs. Another for the big pigs and one for the fattening pigs.

He always kept one or two oxen for fattening and slaughtering in the fall for the market in Shawinigan. He also gave meat to the family of Béatrice Frigon (Gérard's sister) as well as to the family of Lucette Leduc (Hélène's sister).

- She was proud, dignified, distinguished, serious, filled with compassion for all of us and all the people around her. She was a beautiful lady with a heart of gold. We try to pass on all the values she has bequeathed to us to our children who instill them in their own children.
- Mom forgave us everything, always helped us gently, without judging, without getting angry; she was so understanding. She helped us even if she was exhausted. She was very affectionate, she consoled us when we had problems, when we were sad, she prepared noodle soup and « blanc manger » pudding when we were sick.
- Mom had a grade 9 education, she had impeccable handwriting and didn't make mistakes. She must have been a model student. She wrote the cheques and took care of household finances and of our education. She was honest and brave. At every birthday party, she made us a cake. She remodelled adult coats into children's coats. Although she was tired, she never complained.
- Having 10 children, working so much! What courage! What patience! What selflessness! You gave it
 your all, you died of cancer at the age of 59. You have dedicated your whole life to us!
- We dare to believe in eternity because our love for you, mom, will last for eternity. You are in our hearts forever! Your love for us has become a love for you without limit.
